It's an ideal setting for experiencing St. Croix's rich heritage.

You will be welcomed by knowledgeable local guides, who will take you through the charming 19th century West Indian greathouse, authentically furnished just

as it was at the beginning of the 20th century. Walk through rooms filled with locally crafted furniture, antiques, historic photographs and memorabilia. Learn about the Lawaetz, a prominent

Danish-American family that has owned and farmed Estate Little La Grange since 1896. Most likely, your guide will be a family member.

Little La Grange is still an operating farm, growing fruits, herbs and vegetables for a local market. Visitors are encouraged to wander around the tropical gardens and shady orchards that surround the main house. Those who are more energetic can explore the hiking trail that takes you to exotic local flora and romantic historic ruins.
